a car bomb into Times Square on Saturday evening in what turned out to be an unsuccessful attack, Justice Department officials announced. Mr. Shahzad was taken into custody at Kennedy International Airport as he tried to board a flight to Dubai, the United States attorney general, Eric H. Holder Jr., said.
