Rinke John One might think of John Rinke as a bridge between pioneer Warren and the present city complex, since his grandfather purchased their homesite at Masonic

Avenue and Hoover Road in 1862 and it was where he was born and lived. John grew up in a house built by his father on the site of his grandfather's log cabin of more than a century ago. The old homestead was also Mr Rinke's birthplace 43 years ago on June 5, 1884. He attended Warren district school and St Clements school in Center Line. Most of his life was spent in farming. When Mr Rinke's grandfather built his log shelter on Trombly in the early days of the Nineteenth Century, the crops were confined to a few acres of land between stumps. Timber wolves and wild life abounded to Mr Rinke, is on the threshold of a great development. The Warren Co operative business was run by John A Rinke manager and Anthony G Weigand secretary-treasurer. "Red" and "Tony" are also directors. Other officers and directors include Louis Busch, president, Ed J Schoenherr, vice president, Fred Schuster, Henry Halmich and Joseph C Murphy. The Warren Co operative was the most famous farmer related business in Warren for the time we had farmers. They sold feed, seed, coal, flour, fertilizer, gasoline, motor oils, farm implements, coffee, and stock and poultry tonics. This firm helped local farmers by keeping prices low. They engaged in co-operative buying and selling of farm and garden supplies, and its slogan is "We Try to Satisfy." The building was first owned by John Wilson. It was sold to A Van Dyke Church in 1911. Mr Wilson retained the flour mill. Mr church sols to the Warren farm Bureau Local which shortly re-organized as Warren Cooperative company. A warehouse addition was made in 1924 and a front office built, followed by another warehouse in 1926 and a covered shed. In 1927 a gasoline distributing station was installed. A coal car unloader was purchased. He was widely known as the head of the Warren Cooperative, a farm supply and mill originally built about 1889, and someone actively in education as he matured. Mr. Rinke was a member of the committee that represented the Agricultural Association of Warren when the mill was purchased in 1919. His interest in the village covered many civic events and organizations, and he was instrumental in helping the local banks reorganize when the depression impacted that small community severely. His interest in education covered service with a Board of Education of a local school for 15 years as it grew from a one-

room building to two rooms. As a local farmer, he was involved with 4-H work and often judged animals at their events. He added a gasoline pump in front of his store in 1910. They strained the gas through a chamois to filter out the water and sold it one gallon at a time.. Sons Ed and Norbert sold gasoline. In 1917 Joseph opened an auto agency. He sold Buick and Oakland autos. We know they have sold Chevrolet cars for years. Chevrolet itself started in 1911. They built a new brick building in 1926. They started selling Cadillac in 1931. In 1948 GM wanted the dealerships to change to exclusive dealerships. This led to each brother getting a separate dealership. Ed sold Chevrolet. Norbert sold Cadillac and Pontiac

Rinke, Joseph Was town's hip treasurer and used to go around the county in horse and buggy collecting taxes his sons Norb and Ed used to also help. They carried a record book and a 32 cal revolver for protection.

Rinke, George Member of the famous Rinke family. He ran an appliance store in the Rinke building for many years. He then went to work for the City of Warren. George married Edna DeLong in 1929.

Rinke, Frank The following narrative is one of the few surviving chapters of *Pioneering in Warren Township* by Anna Kluck. *Pioneering in Warren Township* as Frank Rinke saw it. "Getting possession of a parcel of land in Warren township during the late 1800's was only the first step of a long and arduous task. All of this area was covered with forest, dense undergrowth and marshes. Trees had to be cut and the brush cleared away and ditches dug to drain off the swamp water. As the first settlers swung their axes into the first tree trunks, bush tailed squirrels scampered up nearby trees and from their lofty vantage point, peered curiously at the noisy invaders of their forest domain. Round eyed coon and timid rabbits stood on their hind legs at a distance and peeped warily through the brush. In the surrounding marshes frogs croaked continuously

while clouds of whirring mosquitoes hovered above them. Birds of every hue and color sent their songs echoing through the forest. One after another the tall trees swayed, creaked painfully as they parted from their live giving roots and crashed to the earth. The branches were chopped off and made into cord wood. The trunk, if of good timber, would be taken to the mill to be cut into lumber. In the spring, when the ground was soft, half loads of logs were hauled as far as Beebe's toll gate, the entrance to the plank road in Warren. There the logs were unloaded and the settler went back after another half load of logs. Meanwhile, many stops had to be made to remove the sticky clay from the wagon wheels where it collected in huge amounts. On his return to the toll gate with the second half load, the settler piled the first half back on the wagon and began the long trip to Detroit by way of the Plank road, now known as Sherwood. It required good teamwork on the part of man and beast to make a successful trip. Horses strained at their harnesses, sweating, foaming, panting, while their master encouraged, cajoled or cursed them, according to his temperament. The surrounding woods echoed with French, German and Irish epithets. The horses, being intelligent animals, were expected to understand. If they failed to respond, a slap of the reins across their sweating flanks always helped. Always there were the mosquitoes, buzzing about the ears of the drivers and the horses and man and beast winced at their sharp sting. It took six hours of this to reach the saw mill in Detroit. After the trees were cut and the brush cleared away, a still greater task remained: the removal of the stumps. Since the roots were deeply embedded and entwined in the earth, only the smaller roots were pulled out the first year. They were set aside and allowed to decay. The next year they were piled about the larger stumps and set afire, thus burning out the large stump. Meanwhile, the settler plowed between and around them, carrying with him an axe to cut the roots when the plow became embedded in them. An attempt was made to make a straight furrow by placing markers at each end of the field with which to line up. For the first few years corn was raised between the stumps and grew into tall healthy stalks such as is seldom, if ever seen today. Corn was planted because it could be harvested by hand. Grain was not sown until

most of the stumps had been uprooted and destroyed. “ (Anna Kluck Pioneering in Warren Township)

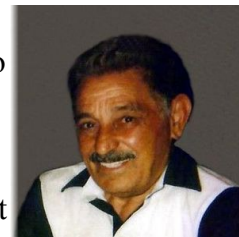

Rocca, Pasquale, age 93 of Warren, died Saturday, February 15, 2014 surrounded by his loved ones at home. He was born on May 22, 1920 in Valdez, Colorado, son of the late Angelo and the late Raphaela (nee: Recchia) Rocca.

Coming from parents of Italian descent, it was the state of Colorado that they chose to settle in upon emigrating to America,...and there that they welcomed their new son, Pasquale. Three years later, with homesickness beckoning, the family decided to return to their roots and relocated back to Italy. With Pasquale exiting his teen years just at the juncture of World War II, it was the Italian Army that would make the fateful call for him to join the fight and support his country. Ultimately, the question of just who he should be supporting became an issue, and a source of confusion for many. Though he was serving valiantly alongside his Italian patriots, the fact of his American citizenship just couldn't be ignored. But prior to all of this, his time served was not without its interesting highlights,...one of which involved a rather telling change for Pasquale. Possessing some natural talents in the kitchen, it was no surprise that part of his wartime responsibilities involved feeding the soldiers. On one fateful day,



he prepared a meal that just happened to be the dinner a visiting General was to consume. After tasting some of Pasquale's cooking, the General became inquisitive as to who had created such a good meal. Upon learning it was Pasquale, the General immediately assigned him as his personal chef. No longer did Pasquale have to join his mates in the mess hall, he was now livin' like the Jefferson's,... "and we're movin' on up to the Big Time!"

Following the war years, Pasquale would go on to work hard and diligently in a variety of fields to include bricklaying, pipe fitting, and various construction projects. Though he was building quite a life for himself, he was doing it alone,...until that special day in Pisa, Italy on February 11, 1950 when he shared the vows of Holy Matrimony with his beloved, Marie. It was then that the journey of building a home, raising a family, and fulfilling dreams took flight. And that "flight" would ultimately find them returning to the United States in search of that American Dream.

Dreams come in many different variations. But for Pasquale & Marie, theirs was in the form of providing tasty delights to the masses,...which meant bringing a new restaurant to their fair city. Hence, it was in 1964 that their dream became a reality when they opened Firenze's Restaurant on 10 Mile Road in Warren,...a staple of the city for 50 years, and a premiere place to enjoy the best Italian cuisine in town. And with Pasquale's cooking prowess, you couldn't go wrong,...or hungry! As for his personal, at-home prerogative, it was all about cooking "naturally." He didn't go for any of that processed food, and never ONCE had a fast-food hamburger. What he ate came from the work of his own hands,...and a little help from the garden.

Pasquale loved his gardens, both vegetable and floral. When it came to his tomatoes, beans, cucumbers, and peppers, there was never a lack for the juiciest and freshest vegetables around. As for his flowers, he nurtured them with the utmost in TLC and enjoyed creating a floral display that was both beautiful and stunning. In 2009, his efforts were so monumental that he was awarded that years prize from the Warren Beautification Committee. It was a very proud moment and recognition for this pillar of Warren.

Another of Pasquale's unique and memorable traits involved his love of making wine. He may not have been donned the crown of Sommelier, but he could produce a damn good wine that would make your toes curl. It was mostly white wine from the Moscato grapes he had shipped in, but it was a white that packed a wallup! It wasn't a wine for commercial consumption, just merely a "family vintage" that was enjoyed by many friends as well. He was generous with his "liquid pleasure,"...but also quite protective of it when it came to his inquisitive (and thirsty) sons.
